


CONFESSION OF SINS AND ANNOUNCEMENT OF FORGIVENESS

- M: In today's Gospel we will hear Jesus say, "I am the vine, you are the branches...and my Father is the gardener....Every branch that bears fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you." Through Baptism we were washed clean and made branches of Jesus, the vine. His word takes away our sins and makes us fruitful for his purposes. Without such mercy and grace we cannot live as branches of our life-giving Vine. Let us consider our need for such forgiveness and confess our sins.
- M: Lord Jesus Christ, living Vine,
- C: we confess that we have taken for granted your grace and mercy, poured out on us in Holy Baptism. We have not appreciated the gravity of our sins, the sacrifice of your life for us, and the full and free forgiveness which you offer in your grace. We have not recognized our heavenly Father's pruning as the loving action it truly is. By your Holy Spirit, increase in us true devotion to your will and a desire to bear fruit worthy of your holy name. Forgive us, restore us, and set our feet on the path of true discipleship.
- M: "If our hearts condemn us, we know that God is greater than our hearts" (1 John 3:20). God sent Jesus as the payment for our sins. As a called servant of Christ I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.



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HOLY GOSPEL St. John 15:1-8



If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples." CONFESSION OF FAITH: THE THIRD ARTICLE OF THE APOSTLES' CREED (SANCTIFICATION)




WORDS OF INSTITUTION




DISTRIBUTION HYMN #441

Celebrating Communion in Love—In love, Jesus gives his body and blood in Holy Communion. In love, Jesus tells us we are prepared for his meal when 1) we recognize our sins and need for forgiveness; 2) we confess Jesus as the only true God and Savior, without whom we would be lost for eternity; 3) we have been instructed in the Biblical truths of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection; 4) we believe that in the Supper Jesus gives us his real body and blood in the bread and wine; 5) we publicly confess our oneness of faith and full agreement of belief with those whom we receive the Supper. In love, Jesus cautions us that if we are not properly prepared, then we are rejecting his love and would receive his Supper to our harm. Therefore, in love for all, we at Immanuel follow the ancient, Biblical practice of Close Communion, offering the Supper only to those who have professed their agreement with our Wisconsin Synod fellowship. If you are interested in receiving the Supper with us, we invite you to speak with our pastor about the important necessary pre-Communion instruction.


